## The Daylight Route Between Montreal, Three Rivers and Quebec

Sail down the lordly St. Lawrence by daylight and enjoy the most delightful river trip on the continent. See the pastoral scenic loveliness, the historic landmarks, the romantic atmosphere of old French-Canada. Sail past Boucherville, Varennes, Vercheres, St. Sulpice, Lanoraie, Berthier, Sorel.

Wind the length of Lake St. Peter to Three Rivers, then on past the shrines and seigneurial manor houses of Cap Madeleine, Batiscan, Portneuf, Pont Rouge, under the famous Quebec Bridge, to Ancient Quebec.

**MONTMORENCY FALLS**  
One hundred feet higher than Niagara, Montmorency Falls may be seen as our steamer swings into Quebec. Nearby is the Kent House, once the residence of the Duke of Kent, father of Queen Victoria.

**MONTREAL**  
Visited in 1535 by Jacques Cartier, who found on this site the Indian village of Hochelaga. A century later Paul de Chomedey, Sieur de Maisonneuve, established the religious settlement of Ville Marie from which has sprung the metropolis of Canada. Here abound landmarks that link us with the storied past. The Chateau de Ramesay, once the headquarters of the Fur Trade, Notre Dame Cathedral, the Seminary of the Sulpician Fathers, the Barracks of St. Helen's Island. Montreal is today the second largest French city in the World, the largest inland seaport of the world, and has a population of one million.



**BOUCHERVILLE**  
Here, in 1668, Pere Marquette, famed for his explorations in the Mississippi Valley, baptized the first Christian Indian child in Canada. Particulars of this historic event may be seen on the Parish Register.

**VERCHERES**  
A picturesque old windmill and the statue of Madeleine Lalieul are visible from our steamer's deck. It was here that this young heroine, a girl of 14, defended her home for days against a bloodthirsty band of Troquois.

**SOREL**  
This city, located at the mouth of the Richelieu River, the outlet to Lake Champlain, was the site of a fort built in 1665 by the Marquis de Tracy, commandant of the Regiment Carignan-Salieres, the first body of French regulars to be dispatched to Canada.

**THREE RIVERS**  
Founded in 1618, Three Rivers is one of Canada's oldest cities. The scene of many Indian forays, Three Rivers is to-day the centre of a thriving industrial district that has sprung from the huge pulp and paper and power developments of the St. Maurice Valley.

**CAP ROUGE**  
Here Jacques Cartier wintered during his second voyage to Canada. It was here, too, that Roberval attempted to form a settlement in 1541, with women and children and a permanent scheme of colonisation. Over two centuries later, Wolfe and his troops floated down the river from opposite Cap Rouge in their memorable night attack that was the gain for them Quebec and Canada.

**QUEBEC**  
Quebec was founded by Samuel de Champlain in 1608, and has played a momentous part in the history of North America. To-day, with its famous shrines and landmarks, its narrow winding streets and medieval buildings, it is like an old-world city transplanted. The Gibraltar of Canada, its towering citadel was long the stronghold of the French in America. From here the formidable Frontenac consolidated the settlements of his predecessors. It was against Quebec that Wolfe launched his attack, recognising it as the key to the mastery of the continent. Behind it is Battlefields Park—the Plains of Abraham—scene of the death struggle in 1759 that finally established Canada as a stronghold of the British crown.

**ISLAND OF ORLEANS**  
Discovered by Jacques Cartier and named by him "The Isle of Bacchus" from the immense quantities of wild grapes he found growing there. It was on the westerly slopes of this island that Wolfe and his army encamped at the start of their campaign against Quebec.
